### **About the Artist**

Robin Duttson works across different media in interconnected projects, taking inspiration from the rich, all-encompassing schemes of Baroque art. His delicate drawings and prints are beautiful in themselves, but they are also part of a wider plan to sculpturally recreate an entire apple tree. Each spring Duttson sets up a temporary orchard studio to draw the short-lived blossoms that he has admired since childhood, in an urgent attempt to capture the level of detail he needs to continue his work through the year. At their simplest level, the artist hopes these drawings convey some of the optimism and frailty of springtime; but they also contribute to the far-reaching scope of his total project, doing their bit to celebrate the richness and depth of our collective experience.

In 2010, Duttson's work was selected for inclusion in Paul Coldwell's book, 'Printmaking: A Contemporary Perspective,' published by Black Dog Books, alongside work by TAG artist Katsutoshi Yuasa and numerous established figures including Julian Opie, Norman Ackroyd, Richard Hamilton and Antoni Tapies. His work appears in numerous collections including the Victoria & Albert Museum collection in London, UK.
