About the Artist

Jamie Lau uses photography, video, installation and sculpture to explore ideas concerning mortality. His work often establishes a play between light and dark, and physical and reflected space, to create an anticipatory symbolism. He is interested in the passage towards a 'decisive moment' within narratives and the drama and uncertainty of what is to follow, and concerned with the unresolved period of specific space and time, where events have yet to fully conclude. Inspired by stories from literature, religion, personal history and the media, his working process involves and allegorical reworking of this source material. To date, passages from Dante's Inferno, the third day of Genesis, the rescue of the Chilean miners and the recent destructive earthquake in New Zealand have been key triggers in the artist's work.
