About the Artist

Susan Aldworth is a visual artist who lives and works in London. Susan studied philosophy at Nottingham University before embarking on a printmaking course at Sir John Cass, London. She has since gained great acclaim for her work as an experimental printmaker and filmmaker, focusing on the exploration of human identity with reference to medicine, neuroscience and philosophy. Through her investigations into consciousness, dementia, schizophrenia, epilepsy and Down's syndrome, Susan has developed a particular interest in expanding notions of contemporary portraiture.

Susan Aldworth has exhibited widely both nationally and internationally, and her work is held in many public and permanent collections, including the Victoria & Albert Museum, The British Museum and The Wellcome Collection Library. Her critically acclaimed solo exhibition 'Susan Aldworth: The Portrait Anatomised' was shown at the National Portrait Gallery, London in 2013. Other solo exhibitions include 'Matter into Imagination' (2006), 'Scribing the Soul' (2008) and 'Reassembling the Self' at Hatton Gallery in Newcastle in 2012, and GV Art in London in 2014. Her etchings printed directly from human brain tissue were shown in TRANSIENCE at GV Art gallery in 2013 and at the Blyth Gallery, Imperial College London, in 2014. She has recently worked with master printer Nigel Oxley on a suite of etching called 'The Entangled Self,' printing directly from human hair.

Susan is a regular presenter on BBC Radio 3 and 4 and is currently working on a project exploring sleep, entitled 'The Dark Self' at both Guy's Hospital and York University.
