About the Artist

Jeremy Wood's work fuses art and science in a creative exploration of space. Using GPS satellite technology he expressively records his own digitally-traced movements over land, water and air. The resulting works are personal cartographies, revealing his own tracks via their residual digital image. Wood's work both requires and excites a deeper awareness of our own movements; of travel, navigation, and local areas. His evocative pieces map all sorts of humdrum activities, from the commute to mowing the lawn, transforming them into beautiful artworks and challenging our sense of time, progression and scale.

Wood specialises in public artworks and commissions with an original approach to the reading and writing of places. His work is exhibited internationally and is in a number of major public and private collections. Wood lectures and delivers workshops in schools, museums and galleries, focusing on the artistic application of GPS drawing and mapping.
